1. List various communication strategies used in your school to provide additional information to parents and to increase parent and family engagement in supporting classroom instruction.

- WCE will distribute the Lion's Den weekly newsletter to parents that is developed with participation of the parent-school organization, principal, and staff. It includes school news, a calendar of school activities, and parenting tips related to school achievement such as homework tips, organizational skills, and study skills.
- Conway School District had created a district website to house school websites for each school. Information about homework assignments and pertinent school/classroom information will be available on the school website. Parents may use e-mail to communicate with members of the school staff.
- Each teacher will send home a folder containing student papers and work samples each week. Parents will be asked to sign the folder and send it back to school.
- Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress.
- WCE will provide to parents reports/report cards every nine weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress and upcoming classroom and school events.
- WCE will send parents a parent-friendly letter in the first report card that explains their child's test results and standardized test scores.
- WCE will offer parents a special workshop each year on the school's approach to school improvement-State for the School Report.
- WCE will send brochures home with students, post notices in school facilities and public buildings.
- WCE will use the student handbook, school website, signage at the school entrance, and parent orientation meetings to give parents school information.

2. List the proposed parent meeting, conferences and activities regularly throughout this year and the dates providing flexible meeting times that you have planned to increase parent and family engagement and build staff and parent capacity to engage in these types of efforts. - Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms. Parents will be given a summary of the student's test scores and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts. Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures.
- WCE will offer parents a "Report to the Public" each year to provide an explanation of the statewide assessment system, standards, and other accountability measures.

- PTO will provide a list of volunteer opportunities and solicit ideas for other types of volunteer efforts during orientation of parents. Teachers will explain the requirements to parents and encourage them to become involved in the school.
 - WCE will provide instruction to a parent on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the home environment, including without limitation: role play and demonstration by trained volunteer, the use of and access to the Department of Education website tools for parents, assistance with nutritional meal planning and preparation and other strategies or curricula developed or acquired by the school district for at-home parental instruction approved by the Department of Education.
 - WCE will provide teachers/staff with appropriate Professional Development activities pertaining to Parental Involvement/ Engagement. The State Board of Education's Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools and School Districts shall require no fewer than two (2) hours of professional development for teachers designed to enhance the understand of effective parental involvement strategies.
